Populærvitenskapelig sammendrag av avhandlingen:

Hip fractures is a common injury in Norway, every hour an individual suffers from a hip fracture. The aim of this research project was to explore whether patients received equal care in Norway, and potential consequences of inequity.

The project was based on register data from the National Hip Fracture Register linked with data from the Norwegian Patient Registry and Statistics Norway.

The study showed a significant variation between Norwegian hospitals regarding adherence to evidence-based guidelines for treatment of hip fractures. The main proportion of non-adherence was related to prolonged waiting time and the use of an uncemented prosthetic implants, with increased mortality and reoperations as consequence for the patients. The longest waiting time was observed for patients with high comorbidity, and in hospitals with high patient volumes. Hip fracture patients had a 3-fold increase in mortality the first year after injury, and over 2-fold increase for up to six years.
